FASTING

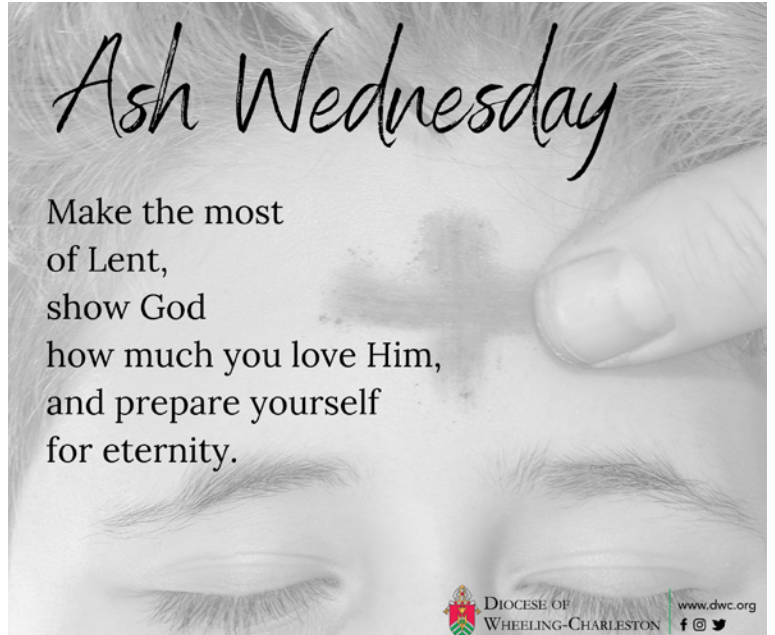

Make the most of Lent, show God how much you love Him, and prepare yourself for eternity.



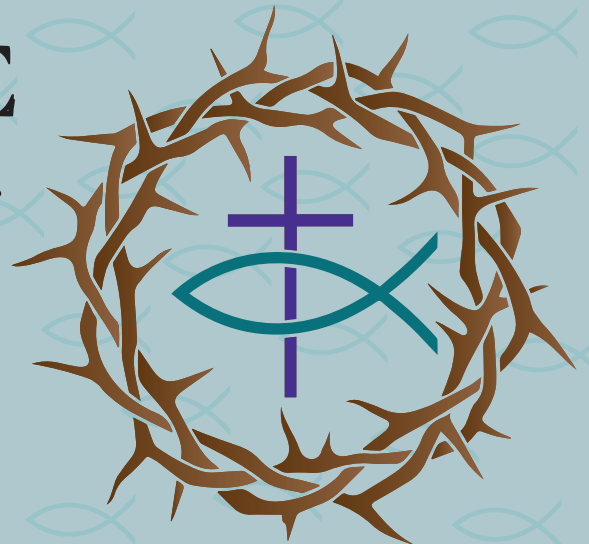
READY TO SERVE

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Christ is Standing at the Door of Your Heart

Will you let Him in?



As we begin our Lenten journey, we share the “I Thirst” meditation. It is often attributed to Saint Teresa of Calcutta (Kolkata), but it was actually written in 1986 by the late Fr. Joseph Langford, MC (Missionaries of Charity Fathers), who was friends with her. It is included in his book, *Mother Teresa’s Secret Fire* (p75).

The meditation emphasizes God’s love for us and the desire for us to always welcome Him into our hearts—the task that St. Teresa’s legacy and the Missionaries of Charity (MC) communities work to fulfill. Inspired by St. Teresa, Fr. Langford was a promoter of the petite sister’s spirituality and wisdom, her focus on “I thirst” – first spoken by Christ on the Cross.

Together St. Teresa and Fr. Langford co-founded the Corpus Christi Movement for diocesan priests, Corpus Christi Fraternity, and the religious congregation of MC Fathers.

Read and listen to it imagining Christ talking to you – directly, sincerely, and fatherly.

“I THIRST”

Christ the King is knocking, will you let Him in?

It is true. I stand at the door of your heart, day, and night.

Even when you are not listening, even when you doubt it could be Me, I am there.

I await even the smallest sign of your response, even the least whispered invitation that will allow Me to enter.

And I want you to know that whenever you invite Me, I do come - always, without fail. Silent and unseen I come, but with infinite power and love, and bringing

the many gifts of My Spirit. I come with My mercy, with My desire to forgive and heal you, and with a love for you beyond your comprehension - a love every bit as great as the love I have received from the Father (“As much as the Father has loved me, I have loved you...” [Jn. 15:10]). I come - longing to console you and give you strength, to lift you up and bind all your wounds. I bring you My light, to dispel your darkness and all your doubts. I come with My power, that I might carry you and all of your burdens; with My grace, to touch your heart and transform your life; and My peace I give to still your soul.

I know you through and through - I know everything about you. The very hairs of your head I have numbered. Nothing in your life is unimportant to Me. I have followed you through the years, and I have always loved you

- even in your wanderings. I know every one of your problems. I know your needs and your worries. And yes, I know all your sins. But I tell you again that I love you - not for what you have or haven’t done - I love you for you, for the beauty and dignity My Father gave you by creating you in His own image. It is a dignity you have often forgotten, a beauty you have tarnished by sin. But I love you as you are, and I have shed My Blood to win you back. If you only ask Me with faith, My grace will touch all that needs changing

in your life; and I will give you the strength to free yourself from sin and all its destructive power.

I know what is in your heart - I know your loneliness and all your hurts - the rejections, the judgments, the humiliations. I carried it all before you. And I carried it all for you, so you might share My strength and victory. I know especially your need for love - how you are thirsting to be loved and cherished. But how often have you thirsted in vain, by seeking that love selfishly, striving to fill the emptiness inside you with passing pleasures - with the even greater emptiness of sin. Do you thirst for love? "Come to Me all you who thirst..."(Jn. 7:37). I will satisfy you and fill you. Do you thirst to be cherished? I cherish you more than you can imagine - to the point of dying on a cross for you.

I thirst for you. Yes, that is the only way to even begin to describe My love for you: I THIRST FOR YOU. I thirst to love you and to be loved by you - that is how precious you are to Me. I THIRST FOR YOU. Come to Me, and I will fill your heart and heal your wounds. I will make you a new creation. and give you peace, even in all your trials. I THIRST FOR YOU. You must never doubt My mercy, My acceptance of you; My desire to forgive, My longing to bless you and live My life in you. I THIRST FOR YOU. If you feel unimportant in the eyes of the world, that matters not at all. For Me, there is no one any more important in the entire world than you. I THIRST FOR YOU. Open to Me, come to Me, thirst for Me, give Me your life - and I will prove to you how important you are to My Heart.

Don't you realize that My Father already has a perfect plan to transform your life, beginning from this moment? Trust in Me. Ask Me every day to enter and take charge of your life - and I will. I promise you before My Father in heaven that I will work miracles in your life. Why would I do this? Because I THIRST FOR YOU. All I ask of you is that you entrust yourself to Me completely. I will do all the rest.

Even now I behold the place My Father has prepared for you in My Kingdom. Remember that you are a pilgrim in this life, on a journey home. Sin can never satisfy you or bring the peace you seek. All that you have sought outside of Me has only left you more empty, so do not cling to the things of this life. Above all, do not run from Me when you fall. Come to Me without delay. When you give Me your sins, you give Me the joy of being your Savior. There is nothing I cannot forgive and heal; so, come now, and unburden your soul.

No matter how far you may wander, no matter how often you forget Me, no matter how many crosses you may bear in this life; there is one thing I want you to always remember, one thing that will never change: I THIRST FOR YOU - just as you are. You don't need to change to believe in My love, for it will be your belief in My love that will change you. You forget Me, and yet I am seeking you every moment

of the day - standing at the door of your heart and knocking. Do you find this hard to believe? Then look at the cross, look at My Heart that was pierced for you. Have you not understood My cross? Then listen again to the words I spoke there - for they tell you clearly why I endured all this for you: "I THIRST..."(Jn. 19:28). Yes, I thirst for you - as the rest of the psalm-verse I was praying says of Me: "I looked for love, and I found none..." (Ps. 69:20). All your life I have been looking for your love - I have never stopped seeking to love you and be loved by you. You have tried many other things in your search for happiness; why not try opening your heart to Me, right now, more than you ever have before.

Whenever you do open the door of your heart, whenever you come close enough, you will hear Me say to you again and again, not in mere human words but in spirit: "No matter what you have done, I love you for your own sake. Come to Me with your misery and your sins, with your troubles and needs, and with all your longing to be loved. I stand at the door of your heart and knock ...Open to Me, for I THIRST FOR YOU...

This June, Two Bishops will Lead a Eucharistic Procession on Ohio River



NATIONAL Eucharistic Pilgrimage

DiCenzo, Staff writer for The Steubenville Register STEUBENVILLE, Ohio — The Diocese of Steubenville and the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston will sponsor a joint diocesan National Eucharistic Pilgrimage event on the Ohio River, June 23.

Bishop Paul J. Bradley, apostolic administrator of Steubenville, and Bishop Mark Brennan will lead a Eucharistic procession on a sternwheeler and move south on the Ohio River.

The National Eucharistic Pilgrimage is part of the National Eucharistic Revival, a three-year initiative sponsored by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, which began in June 2022. According to the timeline on the National Eucharistic Revival's website - www.eucharisticrevival.org: "This will be one of the largest Eucharistic pilgrimages in history. Just as crowds followed Christ throughout his earthly ministry, our nation will process with our Eucharistic Lord over 6,500 miles - through cities, along highways, and past rural towns - on his way to the 10th National Eucharistic Congress."

The National Eucharistic Congress will take place at Lucas Oil Stadium, Indianapolis, and in nearby downtown venues within walking distance, July 17-21, according to the National Eucharistic Congress' website: www.eucharisticcongress.org.

The National Eucharistic Pilgrimage has four trails: the Marian Route (North), the St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Route (East), the St. Juan Diego Route (South) and the St. Junipero Serra Route (West). Details are available on the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage's website: www.eucharisticpilgrimage.org.

The St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Route will be making a stop in Steubenville June 21-23.

Deacon Randall Redington, clergy co-chairperson of the Diocesan Eucharistic Revival Core Committee, and his wife, Mary Ellen, lay co-chairperson, announced a "Sing-spiration" event, scheduled from 6-7 p.m., June 21, at Historic Fort Steuben's Berkman Amphitheater, Steubenville. The

core committee expects the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage's St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Route to arrive around 7 p.m. in Steubenville, and this event will serve as a way to prepare and welcome the pilgrims.

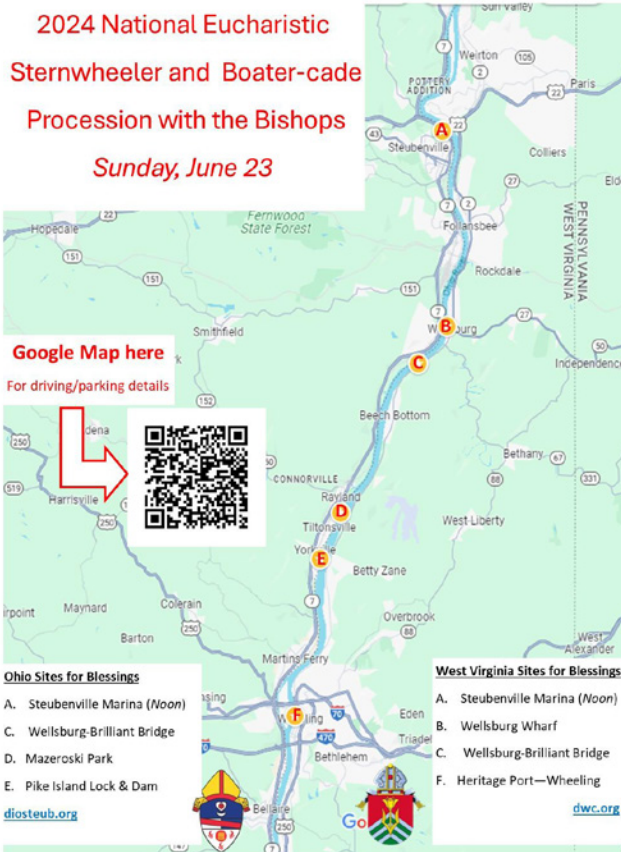
On June 23, Bishop Bradley will celebrate a 10 a.m. Mass at Holy Rosary Church, Steubenville. After Mass, a procession from the church to a float will take place, followed by a motorcade to the Steubenville marina, the Redingtons said. Once the Blessed Sacrament arrives at the marina, Bishop Bradley, Bishop Brennan and the national pilgrims will board a sternwheeler (seats are by invitation only) with the Eucharist. Parishioners who own boats are encouraged to follow the sternwheeler in an escorted boatercade down the river.

Both states have locations along the banks of the Ohio River for parishioners to gather and receive Eucharistic blessings (see the map and scan the QR code for more details). The locations include the Steubenville Marina (at noon for both the Ohio and West Virginia sides); Wellsburg Wharf; Wellsburg-Brilliant Bridge (Ohio and West Virginia); Mazeroski Park, Tiltonsville (Ohio); Pike Island Locks and Dam at the fishing access point, Yorkville (Ohio); and Wheeling Heritage Port. The Redingtons emphasized that people should "listen for the bell" on the sternwheeler as it approaches them for the blessing. The bell will be rung by the sternwheeler benefactor, President and Captain Bob Harrison of Bellaire Harbor Services, LLC, in memory of Julia Harrison.

Then, the procession will head to the Bellaire Marina. Once everyone arrives, there will be a walking Eucharistic procession to St. John Church, Bellaire. A prayer service will be held, followed by a gathering and meal, according to the Redingtons.

The event will be broadcast from 10 a.m.-5:30 p.m. on Our Lady's Radio, WWGL-FM 97.9; as well as on WDWC-FM 90.7. In addition, it will stream online at www.rdo.to/WLOL (Light of Life Radio Ministry).

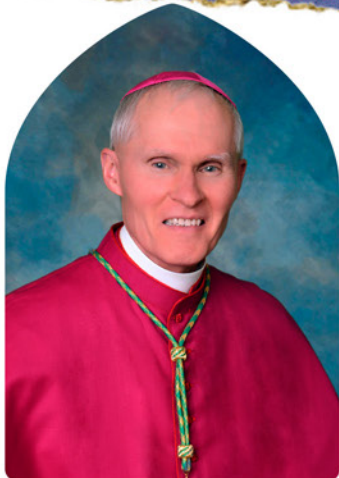

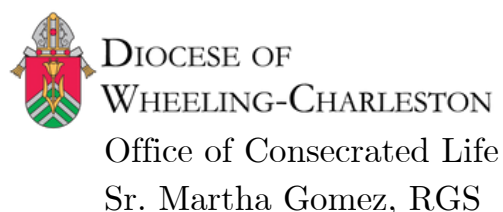
