WV FAITHFUL TO BE Part of the revival

Will you be one of the 250 people to represent the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston at the National Eucharistic Revival in Indianapolis this summer?

Bishop Mark Brennan secured 250 five-day passes for the July 17-21, 2024, event at Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis. More than 80,000 Catholics from across the country are expected to attend the revival.

Hopefully by now you have heard about the opportunity through your pastor and the Eucharistic Revival point person in your parish. The Office of Worship and Sacraments has been working with them since October to get our delegation ready, emphasizing the importance of having all reaches of the diocese represented.

Registration for the travel package is now open to all official parishioners starting this weekend. The first 250 people from the diocese to sign up to be part of the WV delegation will receive a complimentary five-day pass for the national congress as a gift from the Church in WV.

These tickets are only available with purchase of the travel package through Corporate Travel (a Catholic pilgrimage company. See flyer inside this issue and available from your pastor/parish office for links and details).

The diocesan travel package includes bus transportation to Indianapolis, hotel, five-day pass to all the NEC events, and shuttle service each day from hotel to the venue. Cost is based on single or double room. Triple and quad are available to those who can coordinate/secure those. A deposit of \$750 is due upon registration.

As Bishop Brennan has mentioned many times, the National Eucharistic Congress will be a life-changing experience for thousands of Catholics seeking an outpouring of grace, joy, hope, peace, unity, and meaning of Eucharistic faith. Additionally, the experience is a great investment for parish life.

at the National Eucharistic Congress representing their local parishes," he said. "I'm happy we are partnering with Corporate Travel, a Catholic company that specializes in Catholic pilgrimages, to ease the travel logistics burden for us."

As Bishop Brennan has communicated to our priests, this is an opportunity for the whole parish to benefit from so, "I encourage parishes to work together to find ways to finance the travel package for participants. Ideas such as having a fish fry or spaghetti dinner or some other fundraiser...." With the help of their pastors and Eucharistic Revival point persons, delegates should also seek sponsorships from their Knights of Columbus, Ladies Guild, Rosary groups, etc., to help cover the travel package.

Can more than 250 people from the diocese attend? Yes! After the 250 passes are claimed anyone interested in attending will be responsible for the cost of the ticket (\$360), as well as their own travel and accommodations.

Every day at the Congress is designed to facilitate a invigorating encounter with Christ. Attendees will select their preferred series of impact sessions for the morning and breakout sessions for the afternoon. Then, gathered together as one, the whole assembly will experience the powerful revival sessions in Lucas Oil Stadium each evening.

A summary of the event includes:

- Liturgies Mass celebrated in multiple rites and languages.
- Breakout Sessions and Revival Sessions to give you hope, inspiration, and emphasis on God in your life, working through you.
- Expo Hall Apostolates, ministries, orders, publishers, and vendors of Catholic items to enrich your spirit.
- Eucharistic Procession through downtown Indianapolis. (The monstrance that will be used was blessed by Pope Francis on June 19, 2023, in his words, to mark "a significant moment in the life of the Church in the United States.")
- Eucharistic Adoration.
- Sacrament of Reconciliation opportunities.
- Music and much more.





HONOR MARTIN LUTHER KING JR. DAY CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING OUR CALL TO ACT

On Monday we celebrate the life and accomplishments of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., who clearly articulated social justice, nonviolence, and mutual respect for all creation so equality, freedom, and justice would prevail for the common good. Let his legacy remind us that we all have a role in working to end divisions, violence, and injustice. We have a call to act - a responsibility to live up to our Catholic Social Teaching.

King emphasized with is words and actions to meet hate with love, and to show respect towards self, our fellow community members, and to our world, even in the face of differences, challenges, or darkness.

Catholic Social Teaching goes hand in hand with that mindset. It is central to how we are to live Christ's call to love our neighbor as ourselves and become the light of Jesus to seek an end to racism, religious persecution, and all forms of disrespect of human life.

Catholic Social Teaching can be simplified with seven themes:

- 1. Life and Dignity The most fundamental right is the right to life God made each one of us and all are important and should be protected.
- 2. Call to Family, Community, and Participation Have a servant leader mindset, by sharing and helping each other.
- 3. Rights and Responsibilities Have an active role in making sure others are safe and healthy.
- 4. Care for the Poor and Vulnerable Like Christ be a giver and support however you can those marginalized in our communities.
- 5. Dignity and Rights of Workers Approaching work as a gift back to God and for a better community; and ensuring just wage and respect for work completed.
- 6. Solidarity We are all brothers and sisters in God's family purposefully and wonderfully made!
- 7. Care for God's Creation It is our duty to care for our world all creation made by God.

It's one thing to be able to identify our Catholic Social Teaching and honor the legacy of Martin Luther King, but it is most important to take this moment to examine how we are answering God's call to action.

Prayerfully consider how to support service organizations in our parishes and communities with time, treasure, talents, and prayer.

When praying, pray for peace, forgiveness, reconciliation, and genuine empathy.

"I give you a new commandment – love one another! As I have loved you, so you also should love one another." – Jesus Christ (John 13:34)




