SAINT BONAVENTURE devoted his life to spread the love of Christ through his writings and sermons. His theological works about the Gospel of Luke reveal St. Bonaventure's strong devotion to St. Joseph.

The 13th Century friar wrote about St. Joseph's incredible strength, humility, and, most important, the fact that he was chosen by God to fulfill the most crucial role in the life of Jesus and the Virgin Mary.

He emphasized that St. Joseph was a mighty man of integrity, noting that Luke's gospel declares Joseph as a "righteous man." He further interprets Joseph as a descendant of David linking that lineage to the birth of Christ in Bethlehem. He notes as the Guardian of the Holy Family, it is Joseph that is the teacher of Jesus. Therefore, as guardian and protector of the Holy Family we need to revere Joseph as such.

In his sermons, St. Bonaventure, connected the gifts of the Holy Spirit to St. Joseph, defining that as head of the Holy Family it specifically took great piety, wisdom, and fortitude to guard them from evil. He would preach that after the Blessed Mother we need to look to Joseph to intercede for us for he took in God the Son as his own.

St. Bonaventure's Prayer for the Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit

O, Lord Jesus, through You I humbly beg the merciful Father to send the Holy Spirit of grace, that He may bestow upon us His sevenfold gifts.

May He send us the gift of WISDOM, which will make us relish the Tree of Life that is none other than Yourself; the gift of UNDERSTANDING, which will enlighten us; the gift of COUNSEL, which will guide us in the way of righteousness; and the gift of FORTITUDE, which will give us the strength to vanquish the enemies of our sanctification and salvation.

May He impart to us the gift of **KNOWLEDGE**, which will enable us to discern Your teaching and distinguish good from evil; the gift of **PIETY**, which will make us enjoy true peace; and the gift of **FEAR**, which will make us shun all iniquity and avoid all danger of offending Your Majesty.

To the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit be given all glory and thanksgiving forever.

Helping Vulnerable Individuals Reconnect with Their Community

In December, Catholic Charities West Virginia Martinsburg Program Assistant Siobhán Bertone received a letter in the mail from an inmate at the Eastern Regional Jail (ERJ). "Ann," who is nearly 70, had been incarcerated for 14 months, and her release date was quickly approaching. She had no family or friends nearby, nowhere to go, no winter clothes to wear, no ID, no money, and several serious medical issues.

The community responded to an appeal for clothes, food and other items, and Catholic Charities received numerous donations to help Ann. Catholic Charities also received Ann's mail, as she had no other address.

Currently, Ann is staying in a hotel while the West Virginia Coalition for the Homeless finds housing that is more permanent for her. In the meantime, Siobhán continues to work with Ann to ensure that her basic needs are met.

"Catholic Charities has been a Godsend, and they've really helped me get on my feet and get things together," said Ann. "Because on my own, I was going nowhere. They've given me direction, helped me get my food stamps, health care, insurance, medications, my check. If anyone has a chance to connect with them who needs help, please do."

This story is about a community coming together to help one person. For our team at Catholic Charities, this work provides us with an opportunity to live the principles of Catholic Social Teaching while providing professional services to those who are so often unseen.

I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things,


and I desire to receive You into my soul.
