

St. Lawrence of Brindisi ~ Feast Day July 21 CHILD PRODIGY, DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH

Imagine a kindergartener from your parish getting up to the lectern to preach about his faith so enthusiastically that it moves you to be a better Catholic. That was Saint Lawrence of Brindisi, who was considered a child prodigy for his intellect and his ability to capture an audience.


In his day, to honor the bible story of child Jesus preaching in the Temple, Italian boys would preach during the Christmas season in public. When Saint Lawrence was six years old, he delivered a heartwarming sermon on the Child Jesus in his cathedral, which "deeply affected" his congregation and theologians reported it inspired those in attendance to be more faithful Christians.

Saint Lawrence was the son of William

we know him as one of only 36 Doctors of the Church for his influential research, study, and writings, which advance the Church's knowledge and mission.

He was taught by the Capuchin friars and as a young teenager, after the death of his parents and encouragement from his uncle, Saint Lawrence chose to enter the Franciscan priesthood. He was incredibly smart and able to speak Latin, Hebrew, German, Syriac, Bohemian, Spanish, and French, in addition to his native Italian. He adored the Blessed Mother and credited that devotion to his intellectual strength and captivating preaching.

According to one account of his life, "While he was saying holy Mass in Munich in the chapel of the duke of Bavaria, our Lord appeared after the elevation in the form of a resplendent Child, who lovingly caressed the saint. Frequently Saint Lawrence of Brindisi was so affected during the celebration of holy Mass that he shed copious tears. Altar linens thus



moistened with his tears were later used on the sick, and they were cured as were the faithful by the kerchiefs of St Paul."

Speaking from St. Peter's Square in 2011 Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI said, "Even the simplest members of the faithful, those not endowed with great culture, benefited from the convincing words of Lawrence, who addressed humble people to remind them all to make their lives consistent with the faith they professed.

"Lawrence urged everyone, and not only priests, to cultivate a life of prayer, for it is through prayer that we speak to God and that God speaks to us: 'Oh, if we were to consider this reality' (St. Lawrence exclaimed in his writings). 'In other words that God is truly present to us when we speak to him in prayer; that he truly listens to our prayers, even if we pray only

BATHROOMS RENOVATED AT THE CATHOLIC CHARITIES NEIGHBORHOOD CENTER

Thanks to the support of local donors and community partners, the restrooms and showers at the Catholic Charities Neighborhood Center in Wheeling are once again open to neighbors.

At the Catholic Charities West Virginia (CCWVa) Shining a Light on Hope Gala in March 2020, local donors pledged over \$20,000 to renovate the restrooms at

the Neighborhood Center. Due to the pandemic, the renovations were delayed until the beginning of 2021. The restrooms and shower replace the outdoor shower station trailer, which throughout 2020 was located in a parking lot across the street from the Center.

While the Neighborhood Center is still closed to the public, showers are available by signing up during breakfast service. The showers are being staffed by CCWVa employees as well as recovery coaches from Project Rebound.

Mehdi Ayari, Case Manager for Homeless Outreach at the Neighborhood Center, is also available to help neighbors apply for social security or disability, secure an ID or license, and connect to local housing options.

"A hot meal or a warm shower may be the beginning of a conversation," said Ayari, "but hopefully a relationship develops where they trust us to work with them on their journey."
