Diocesan Year for the National Eucharistic Revival Begins!



NATIONAL Eucharistic Revival

This weekend is the Solemnity of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ - the feast of Corpus Christi, celebrating the true presence of Christ in the Eucharist. It also begins the Diocesan Year of the National Eucharistic Revival.

The revival has four significant components:

1. Year of Diocesan Revival - this weekend until June 11, 2023 - diocesan events for the faithful centered around Christ's true presence in the Eucharist.

2. Year of Parish Revival - June 11, 2023, to July 17, 2024 – parishes coordinate local events for deeper encounters with Christ through Adoration, Mass, enrichment, etc.

3. National Eucharistic Congress Event - July 17-21, 2024 –Catholics of all ages will gather in Indianapolis for a five-day conference to build enthusiasm among the faithful to be "Eucharistic missionaries."

4. National Year of Mission - July 17, 2024, to Pentecost 2025 – all Catholics are encouraged to evangelize and be a light of Christ in the world.

In honor of the Revival launch, parish and regional Eucharistic Processions will be held all around our diocese. Check with your parish for plans.

King Melchizedek, a priest of God Most High, uses bread and wine to celebrate and bless Abram, also a priest of God Most High.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 110

"You are a priest for ever, in the line of Melchizedek"

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 11:23-26

Institution of the Lord's Supper when we receive the bread and wine during the Eucharist we are receiving the Body and Blood of Christ who died for us and will come again.

Gospel: Luke 9:11b-17

Luke shares the story of Jesus welcoming the crowd, telling them about heaven, and curing those needing healing. Christ also took five loaves and two fish, looked to heaven and blessed them. The people ate their fill.
