



PENTECOST ~BIRTH OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

On this day more than 2,000 years ago, devout Jews from every nation were in Jerusalem for the Jewish feast of Pentecost, which was celebrated at that time as a harvest feast as well as a commemoration of Moses' having received the Jewish law on Mount Sinai.

It had been a week since they watched Jesus ascend into the clouds to Heaven. The apostles had gathered with Mary to pray, when a startling wind blew through the house and the Holy Spirit appearing as tongues of fire came upon them.

Jesus had told them at the last supper that an advocate would be sent by God. He said, "the Holy Spirit, that the Father will send in my name—he will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you. So, Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. Not as the world gives, do I give it to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid." – John 14:26-27

More amazing on this day, was that the men began speaking languages of all the nations. Languages they previously didn't know. These once timid disciples were now enthusiastic apostles able to speak Christ's word.

The apostles went out immediately evangelizing. About 3000 people were baptized that day after hearing St. Peter's passionate message calling for repentance and conversion (Acts 2:14-41).

Gifts of the Holy Spirit for us

St. Paul reminds us that the gifts of the Holy Spirit dwell in each of us.

He explains how the sharing of the various spiritual gifts of the Holy Spirit enriches the Church.

Paul lists the fruits of the Spirit in his Letter to the Galatians 5:22-25:

"What the Spirit brings is ... love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.

"Since the Spirit is our life, let us be directed by the Spirit"

So, let us all listen to St. Paul and recognize these gifts, using each one for the benefit of others, our world, and the Church.

Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love.

V. Send forth your Spirit, and they shall be created.

R. And You shall renew the face of the earth.

O, God, who by the light of the Holy Spirit, did instruct the hearts of the faithful, grant that by the same Holy Spirit we may be truly wise and ever enjoy His consolations. Through Christ Our Lord. Amen.



JULIA GREELEY ~ ANGEL OF CHARITY

She was called Denver's Angel of Charity and a guardian of firefighters. Servant of God Julia Greeley was in Missouri into slavery, but once freed she traveled to Denver Colorado, where she spent the rest of her life showing mercy, love, and charity to others. Her birthdate is unknown, but biographers estimate it to have been between 1833-1848. She was a slave until 1865, when Missouri finally freed slaves (two years after the national Emancipation proclamation).

On Tuesday, June 7, the anniversary of her death, we honor her by sharing her story and praying for her canonization.

When Greeley arrived in Denver, she first worked for the Gilpin family. William Gilpin had been the first governor of the Colorado Territory in 1861. The family was Catholic and attended Sacred Heart Catholic Church. Julia Greeley learned about the faith through Mrs. Gilpin and joined the Catholic Church in 1880. She became devoted to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

Although she was considered poor herself, Greeley was often seen pulling a little red wagon of things she collected to give to the poor - clothes, food, firewood, fuel. If it were useful or needed, she'd do her best to find it and deliver, but she did so at night so she would not embarrass the person or family she was helping.

Greeley took a job for a Denver couple who needed help around the house. She knew they were Catholic, but the couple did not have any children. She was confused by that, so she had asked and they told her they were not able to have children, and that they were expecting once, but lost the child before birth. Greeley confidently told them they would have a child. She knew it because she would pray for them. Sure enough the couple had a baby that Greeley called the "Little

White Angel." In fact, the only photo that is known to exist of Greeley is her holding the child.

Because Greeley walked the city daily, she would visit Denver's 15 firehouses. She began the first Firefighters' Prayer Union. She called it, "The League of the Sacred Heart." She would "enroll" each firefighter into the league by giving each a cloth badge, which represented the protection prayers she would offer for them. She called them the "tickets for Heaven."

When she died the procession of visitors at her funeral lasted five hours. It was then, when the Church and the city could see the merciful and giving life of a saint she led.



The prayer for her intercession:

Heavenly Father, your servant Julia Greeley dedicated her life to honoring the Sacred Heart of your Son and to the humble service of the poor. Grant to me a generous heart like your Son's, and if it be in accordance with your holy will, please grant this favor I now ask through Julia's intercession (insert intention). I pray this through Christ our Lord. Amen

from enrollments in the Julia Greeley Firefighters Prayer Union are shared evenly between the Julia Greeley Home (a nonprofit residential home helping homeless women rebuild their lives), and in Denver, the Denver Fire Fighters Charitable Foundation. Outside of Denver, firefighters requested that we share the proceeds between the Julia Greeley Home and Tunnel to Towers Foundation (a nonprofit dedicated to supporting firefighters, first responders, and military who have given the ultimate sacrifice).

“Peace be with you.”
