Let Lent Strengthen Your Goodness


The Gospel for this First Sunday of Lent (Luke 4:1-13) happens right after a high point in the life of Christ – His baptism at the Jordan River.

GLORIFY GOD LIKE St. Frances of Rome



We don't always get to do want we want, but if we keep our hearts with Christ, we will find joy in our circumstances like St. Frances.

She was born in Rome in the year 1384. Her family was both respected and wealthy. As a child St. Frances wanted nothing more than to enter religious life, but her father arranged a marriage to a young nobleman, Lorenzo Ponziani. Although she did not want to marry, she obeyed her father and vowed to glorify God in all she did. Saint Frances married at the age of 13.

Saint Frances was devoted to her kind husband and her faith. The latter is how she formed a strong bond and relationship with her sister-in-law Vannozza. The two would pray together and with their husbands' approval would help the poor in their community.

Frances and her husband had three children – two sons and a daughter – Battista (for John the Baptist), Giovanni, and Agnes.

A terrible plague took over Rome, taking the lives of many including Giovanni and Agnes.

In their honor St. Frances worked harder to help the poor and sick. She sold her possessions in order to pay for their needs. When their own funds were exhausted, she and Vannozza went door to door for donations and supplies.

She founded a group of lay women dedicated to prayer and helping the poor.

One interesting story from the life of St. Frances was published by Catholic Online:

Frances gave orders that no one asking for alms would be turned away and she and Vannozza went out to the poor with corn, wine, oil and clothing. Her father-in-law, furious that she was giving away their supplies during a famine, took the keys of the granary and wine cellar away from her.

Then just to make sure she wouldn't have a chance to give away more, he sold off their extra corn, leaving just enough for the family, and all but one cask of wine. The two noblewomen went out to the streets to beg instead.

Finally, Frances was so desperate for food to give to the poor she went to the now empty corn loft and sifted through the straw searching for a few leftover kernels of corn. After she left Lorenzo came in and was stunned to find the previously empty granary filled with yellow corn. Frances drew wine out of their one cask until one day her father-in-law went down and found it empty. Everyone screamed at Frances. After saying a prayer, she led them to cellar, turned the spigot on the empty cask, and out flowed the most wonderful wine. These incidents completely converted Lorenzo and her father-in-law.


The Veil Removed

Short Film Ignites Amazement of Mass

As we begin our journey through Lent, let us focus on the greatest love – the Love of Christ celebrated at every Mass in churches around the world – to motivate us.

Feel the greatest love. Reflect on that love.

Wouldn't it be truly amazing if we could see Christ, the choirs of angels, the saints, and our deceased loved ones surrounding us at Mass?



The Veil Removed even reminds us that the CCC also teaches us that our deceased loved ones, saints, and angels join us at Mass.

To the offering of Christ unites not only the members still here on earth, but also those already in the glory of heaven. In communion with and commemorating the Blessed Virgin Mary and all the saints, the Church offers the Eucharistic sacrifice. In the Eucharist the Church is as it were at the foot of the

cross with Mary, united with the offering and intercession of Christ (CCC 1370)

The inspiration for the short film was the result of a radio show, Catholic Women Now, when hosts Magruder and Julie Nelson presented a segment called, "How Heaven and Earth come together during the Mass."

Following that show, Magruder was praying at Mass when she felt the "Lord calling her to show the world what they would see during every Mass if the veil was removed," the website noted.

So, after much prayer and rallying of a team of 65 individuals her team came together to produce a film to "incite curiosity, generate excitement and desire to learn and love the Holy Mass and Eucharist."

Magruder's group teamed up with Spirit Juice Studios of Chicago (who produced Reel Homilies with Fr. Tim Anastos) and made the film of Mass "through modern storytelling, high-quality production and a faithful representation of the beauty of the Eucharist."

Five years later and with more than 2.8 million views the film is now available in 9 languages other than English.

Take time this Lent to watch and share The Veil Removed. Make sure to check out their website which also offers free webinars (recorded) to follow along individually or with a group; recommended publications; online shop of resources; and an opportunity to donate to the non-profit to continue its mission.

That is exactly what the group The Veil Removed has aimed to do through their short seven-minute film titled by the same name (available at THEVEILREMOVED.COM).

The Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston has posted the video on its social media pages (such as Facebook - www.facebook.com/DioceseofWheelingCharleston) repeatedly since the film was created in December of 2019.

As Catholics, many of us can lose sight or take for granted the transubstantiation – the fancy official term for the awesome moment when the bread and wine truly become the Body and Blood of Christ. Sadly, many think the Eucharist is just symbolic – thus the need for our National Eucharistic Revival efforts.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) declares the Eucharist is the "source and summit" of our Catholic faith – the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ (CCC 1324-1327).

Plain and simple – Christ made the ultimate sacrifice for us, giving us salvation on His Cross.

Chris Magruder, founding member of The Veil Removed declares on their website the sole mission of the film is a soul mission, "to increase participation and understanding of the Eucharist by igniting amazement through the miraculous beauty of the Catholic Mass."

It illustrates where heaven on earth meet at the Mass as seen by the saints and mystics, and revealed in the New Testament and the CCC.
